

Sport Premium Grant Statement 2017 – 2018

Grant Evaluation



The government remained committed to provide additional funding to schools for the academic year 2017/2018. The purpose of the grant is to fund improvements for the provision of sport and PE so that all pupils aged 5 – 11 year olds develop healthy lifestyles. This year Sacred Heart received £19,420 to support and improve the quality and breadth of PE provision.

The Impact of the quality of our Sports Provision and outcomes has been evaluated by the Subject Leaders for PE. Pupils have contributed to this evaluation, through pupil voice discussions. Pupils speak very positively about the increased levels of personal challenge posed by 'Real' PE.

Sacred Heart has achieved the Gold Mark Standard for School Games for the first time in July 2018.

Pupils develop fundamental movement skills (agility, balance and co-ordination) In addition – funding has provided new resources for indoor PE including a full set of replacement mats for Gymnastics.
Provide markings on the playground.	£350	Not actioned as areas were unsuitable due to flooding - To be carried over to next year.
Transport to competitions	£950	Pupils transported safely to a range of venues.
Provide indoor storage for Key Stage Two sport	£500	A new cupboard, storage shelves and hooks is fully installed in the key stage Two hall. A new portable mat stand for gymnastics has been purchased. The building of the storage cupboard also meant that large apparatus had to be re-located in the Key Stage Two hall, the unused ropes system has now been removed. Access to a range of good quality equipment is now fully in place.

Sports Premium Grant goes towards these initiatives, however the school budget subsidises any short fall. In addition during 2017 – 2018, additional funding was gained for the above areas through FOSH fundraising and through LCVAP / DFC allocation.
