

Sport Premium Grant Statement 2014 – 2015

The government committed to provide additional funding to schools for the academic years 2013/2014 and 2014/2015. The purpose of the grant is to fund improvements for the provision of sport and PE so that all pupils aged 5 – 11 year olds develop healthy lifestyles. Sacred Heart received £9660 to support and improve the quality and breadth of PE provision.
