The government remains committed to provide additional funding to schools for the academic year 2017/2018. The purpose of the grant is to fund improvements for the provision of sport and PE so that all pupils aged 5 – 11 year olds develop healthy lifestyles. This year Sacred Heart will receive £19,420 to support and improve the quality and breadth of PE provision.
