

| Circumstances | Remote Learning Plan |
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| Child is off sick and unable to attend school <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Illness (not Covid-19 related) • Short-term illness | Child is unable to complete school work and will be able to catch up, when well enough to return to school. |
| Child has to self-isolate at home because: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Child is awaiting test results (Covid-19) • Someone else in the family is awaiting test results (Covid-19) | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The admin staff will ensure that the class teacher is aware of the reason for absence as soon as we are informed by the parent. • If the child is well, parents are asked to keep their child learning using the links from the school website e.g. Oak National Academy, TT Rock Stars etc. • Parents are asked to keep encouraging their child to read. • Test results are usually returned within a couple of days. If the child is returning to school because the Covid-19 test is negative, they will be able to catch up on return to school. • If the absence becomes prolonged a printed work pack will be supplied, which aims to keep the child learning at the same rate as the rest of the class. |
| Child has to self-isolate at home because: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Child tests positive for Covid-19 • Someone else in the family tests positive for Covid-19 <p>OR</p> Have been contacted by 'Track and Trace' and the family needs to self-isolate as instructed. This may be for at least 14 days following advice from the Health Protection Team / DFE. | <p>The class teacher will be responsible for providing the direct teaching as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Printed work packs to be supplied – which aims to keep your child learning at home, at the same rate as the rest of the class, this may be for one week and followed up with a second pack for week two. • Work packs can be collected from school, or we can make arrangements for the delivery of the pack to your home, if it is impossible to collect. • A weekly telephone call / Teams chat is made by the teacher (as a minimum) as appropriate to the age and stage of development of the child. • Early Years children will have learning activities and contact with parents through Tapestry. • Later in the Autumn Term, it is anticipated that more of our remote learning plan will be available through Microsoft Teams, which will be alongside printed materials. • Materials will also be available on the school website. <p>The parent is responsible for:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ensuring their child completes work on each school day at home in line with the Pupil Remote Learning Policy. • Supervising the child's learning. • Contacting the class teacher about any difficulties the child has with learning. • Returning all learning packs, resources and completed work to school promptly for marking and feedback at the appropriate time. |

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| <p>Child sent home, because their bubble at school has closed. The child may be at home for at least 14 days following advice from the Health Protection Team / DFE.</p> | <p>The class teacher will be responsible for providing the direct teaching as follows:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Printed work packs to be supplied – which aims to keep your child learning at home for the first five days of self-isolation. (School days 1 – 5) • We aim to send work packs home with your child on the day of closure (if time permits). If not, work packs can be collected from school, or we can make arrangements for the delivery of the pack to your home, if it is impossible to collect. • A weekly telephone call / Teams chat is made by the teacher (as a minimum) as appropriate to the age and stage of development of the child. • Early Years children will have learning activities and contact with parents through Tapestry. • Later in the Autumn Term, it is anticipated that more of our remote learning plan will be available through Microsoft Teams, which will be alongside printed materials. • Materials will also be available through the school website • During the second part of isolation (school days 6 – 10) we will provide a second home learning pack, which will also be available through Microsoft Teams or Tapestry (Early Years), on the school website and as a printed option <p>The parent is responsible for:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ensuring their child completes work on each school day at home in line with the Pupil Remote Learning Policy. • Supervising the child’s work • Contacting the child’s class teacher with any difficulties their child has, with learning. • Returning all learning packs, resources and completed work to school promptly for marking and feedback at the appropriate time. |
