

Sport Premium Grant Statement 2016 – 2017

Evaluation Statement

The government remains committed to provide additional funding to schools for the academic year 2016/2017. The purpose of the grant is to fund improvements for the provision of sport and PE so that all pupils aged 5 – 11 year olds develop healthy lifestyles. This year Sacred Heart will receive £9710 to support and improve the quality and breadth of PE provision.

Sport Premium Grant 2016 – 2017

The Governing Body has used the Sports Premium Grant to support the children in their learning in the following ways. Sports Premium Grant goes towards these initiatives, however the school budget subsidises any short fall.

Purchase of PE resources for curriculum sports activities and storage e.g. new football goals, netball posts etc.	£2,036	New equipment including football goals, netball posts, small sports equipment including badminton rackets, small bats, a range of balls etc. purchased. Storage for equipment purchased. Large steel container removed from site (Oct 16) and old equipment discarded. PE equipment is now more easily accessible.
Purchase of sport kit	£440	Pupils representing Sacred Heart present a strong team approach in inter-schools sports competitions.
To release the PE subject leader for consortium liaison meetings	£600	The role of the Subject Leader for PE has developed through liaison with consortium and through training. The PE subject Leader has audited equipment and re-organised resources. Strong links have been established between Wigan schools and a programme of sports competitions planned. The PE subject Leader has introduced the daily mile following training.
